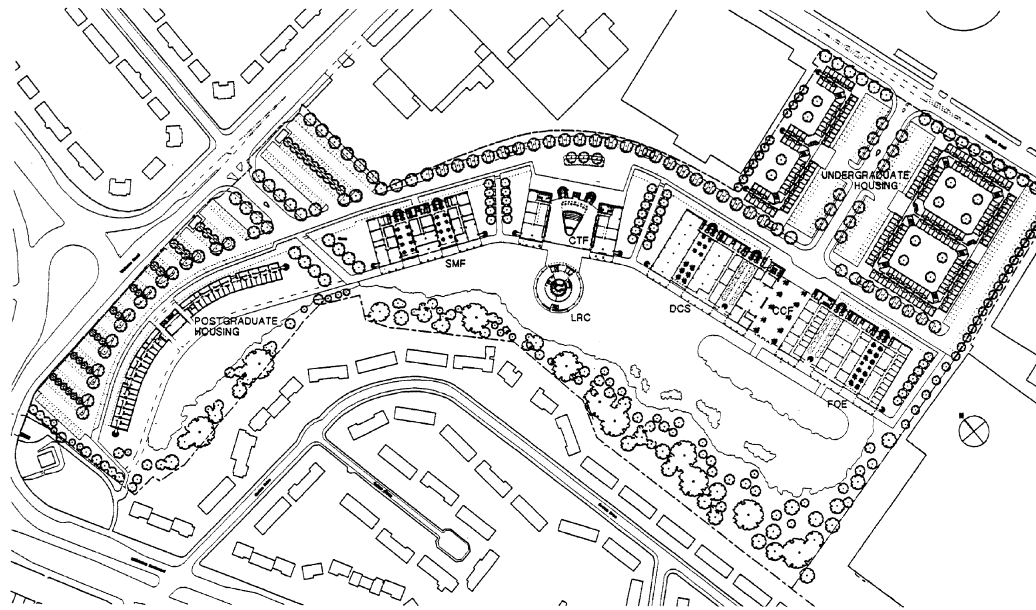


Figure 4.17 Canalside development, Nottingham: offices and restaurants.

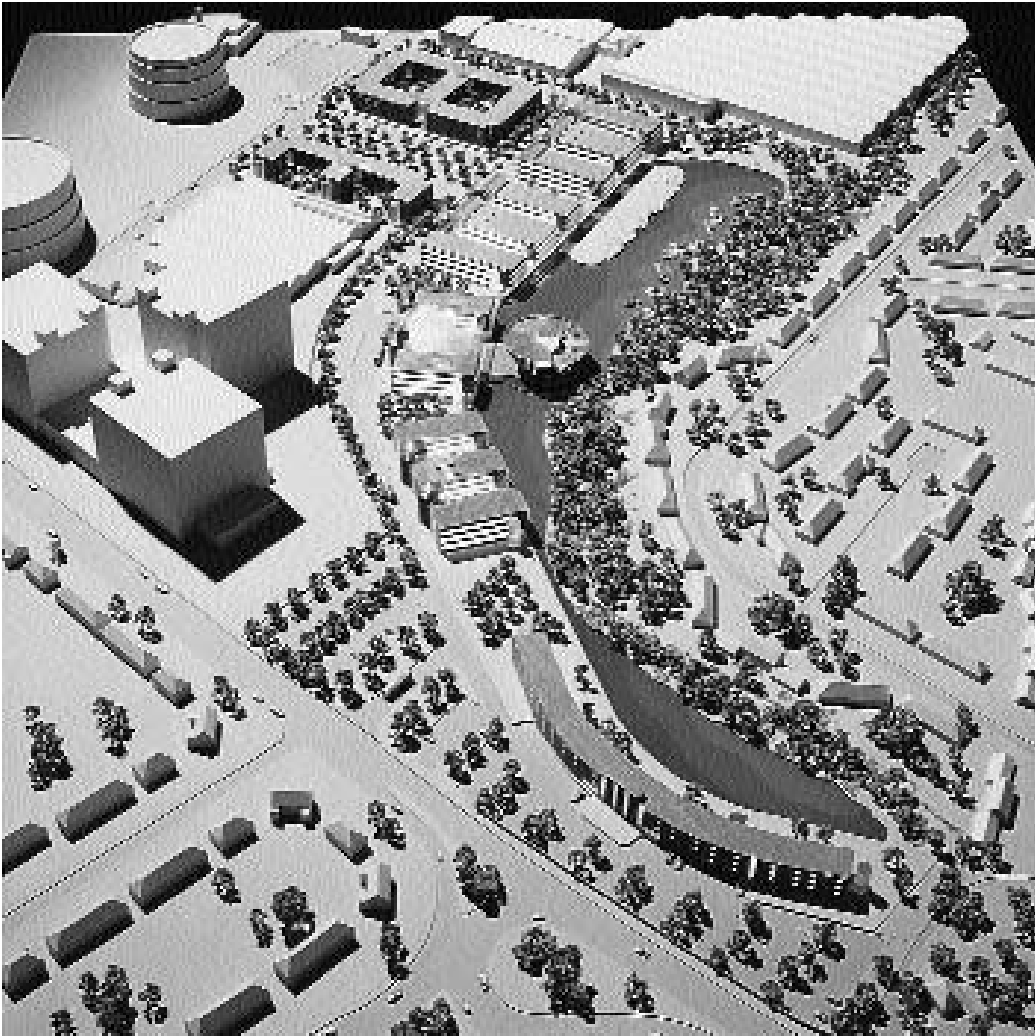


Figure 4.19 The New Campus for the University of Nottingham, by Michael Hopkins and Partners: axonometric.
