plug-in, for example, gives you the ability to ban use of certain URLs or certain IP addresses in comments on your blog, thus cutting down on comment spam. Another popular plug-in, NowPlaying, lets you display the names of songs you are currently listening to in iTunes. Learn more about available plug-ins at www.mt-plugins.org.

In Figure 6-5, you can see an example of a blog run using Movable Type. Joi Ito, chairman of Six Apart Japan (Six Apart is the company behind Movable Type), runs his own blog using MT at joi.ito.com.



Movable Type 3.1 can be run on several operating systems but does require that your Web server allow you to run CGI scripts and have Perl 5.004_04 or better installed.

Movable Type has several pricing options, but for commercial purposes the costs range from \$199.95 to \$1,299.95 depending on the number of users. The \$199.95 package includes an unlimited number of Web logs and five users. Not-for-profit organizations can get a similar software package for \$49.95. No matter which package you ultimately need, you can begin by using a limited version of the software for free.

Six Apart can also install Movable Type on your Web server for you for a fee.
